

BY PLANE

Bergamo Orio al Serio International Airport - www.milanbergamoairport.it

About 50 km from Brescia - Ryanair's European HUB, connects Italy and the main European cities with low cost flights.

BY TRAIN

Brescia is strategically located on the Milan - Venice railway line. It is served by both regional trains and high-speed trains.

Trains to / from **Milano Centrale**: regional train (1 h 7 min, departure approximately every hour) - high speed (36 min, departure every half hour)

Trains to / from **Verona Porta Nuova**: regional train (43 min, departure approximately every hour) - high speed (35 min, departure every half hour)

Trains to / from Roma Termini: Frecciarossa, Frecciargento or Italo Treno high-speed trains (approximately 3 and a half hours, departing every half hour).

HIGHWAY A4 - Exit Brescia Ovest

After the toll, do not turn right towards Brescia, but go straight on

Go all the way down Via Orzinuovi up to the two roundabouts; keep on both right; and immediately after the second roundabout on the right there is an indication for the parking (underground and elevated).

Together with the Capitolium archaeological area and the San Salvatore monastery complex, Santa Giulia Museum is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.




TRANSPORTATION


Each participant will be able to:

BRESCIA AT THE TIME OF THE ROMANS

Brescia boasts the largest Roman archaeological area of northern Italy. This important historic heritage lies in the heart of the city and since 2011 has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site in combination with San Salvatore - Santa Giulia monumental complex.

To discover Roman Brescia, start from Piazza del Foro, one of the oldest squares in Brescia, adjacent to Via Musei.

Piazza del Foro is a sort of city navel: it's the crossroads between the old Decumanus, the main east-west street in Roman times, and Cardus, the north-south street. This was the centre of the city's civil, political, business, and trade life. By the square are the remains of the Capitolium Temple (73 A.D.) and the Roman Theatre (1st century A.D.), one of the main Italian theatres at the time with a capacity of 15 thousand spectators.

Opposite the Capitolium Theatre are the small Baroque church of San Zeno al Foro and the remains of the porches that ran around the square perimeter. The ground level at the time was much lower than today's and these remains give a great perspective of where the city was in those old days. By the square, surrounded by historic aristocratic residences, stands Palazzo Martinengo, built in the 17th century and used today to host temporary exhibitions. It also contains a wooden scale model of the whole area giving you a true window over the past of the city.

If the Roman Theatre is still awaiting restoration and is only partially open on special occasions, the Capitolium Temple, also known as Capitoline Temple, has been open since 2013 and has become one of the symbols of Roman Brescia.

BRESCIA IN THE MIDDLE AGES AND IN THE RENAISSANCE

From the Roman period we then move on to the medieval period: Piazza Paolo VI (formerly the Cathedral) political and religious center of Brescia from the municipal era. Here stands the old cathedral or rotunda, a suggestive stone building with a thousand-year history and the contemporary Palazzo del Broletto for centuries the fulcrum of the administrative life of the city, dominated by the characteristic Torre del Pègol. Inside the main courtyard, valuable Romanesque and Renaissance architecture interact with each other. The imposing marble facade of the New Cathedral also stands out in the square, begun in 1604 and surmounted by the third largest dome in Italy.

Through the ancient "new road", where the gunsmiths forged the valuable Brescia armor known all over the world, you arrive in Piazza della Loggia, the most famous, elegant and homogeneous of the city. It was built starting from 1426 at the behest of the authorities of the Serenissima. The buildings of the Loggia, the Monte di Pietà and the Clock Tower fully reveal the markedly Venetian imprint of the place. Here are also preserved the monuments linked to tragic episodes in the history of the city: the X Giornate and, more recently, the memorial stone in memory of the victims of the Piazza della Loggia massacre (May 28, 1974).

BRESCIA ITS CASTLE AND THE PUSTERLA VINEYARDS

The castle known by many as the "Falcone d'Italia" is a fortress that can be considered of medieval origin and dominates the city from the top of the Cidneo hill. However, studies and archaeological excavations have shown the pre-existence of much older structures; including a Celtic temple, a temple and other Roman structures. The fortress has undergone many changes over the centuries; the main ones were made during the Venetian and French domination. The most interesting modification is the transformation of the towers from a square base to a round base, in order to better withstand the blows of the artillery. The Undergrounds of the Brescia Castle are the most mysterious part of the fortress. The visit to the Underground of Brescia Castle is a journey back in time of over 3,000 years of history. W will visit the interiors of the Tower of the French and the Tower of the Prisoners and we will enter the Magazzini dell'Olio.

Located on the slopes of the Castle of Brescia and recognized as one of the oldest urban vineyards in Europe, the Pusterla vineyard is home to centenary vines that in the 1900s earned a gold medal wine at the Northern Italy Wine Competition. Even today it is dedicated to the production of wine and grappa and of jams and jellies made with fruits of native trees. Winston Churchill was among the lovers of Pusterla wine. In 2007 the Slow Food association recognized this vineyard in Brescia with the title of "Historical Heritage of Environmental Agri-food Culture".






POST CONGRESS TOUR

Saturday, September 3rd - Half day guided visit

CA' DEL BOSCO: BETWEEN WINE AND ART

There are places that have a magical effect on those inhabiting them because they express the essence and value of a passion. One of these places is the Ca' del Bosco winery. Because its fusion of art and wine, nature and culture, creates a magical effect: it touches people's spirits and senses. This is why Maurizio Zanella wished to share these sensations, opening a space formerly reserved to lovers of art as well as wine. Visiting Ca' del Bosco is an immersion in complete harmony and intense joy. The enchanting scenery blends with the intellectual provocation of contemporary art: surprising sculptures adorn the landscape with the colors of bronze, marble and steel. There is great similarity between creation of a sculpture brought to light and distilled in pure form and creating an excellent wine. It's the material that calls to the artist: stone awaits whoever intuits the shape it contains and frees it. Land awaits whoever intuits its vocation and, with love, wisdom, clear sight and severe selection, transforms a promise into color, taste and aroma that light up the whole world's eyes in pleasure. And so for anyone with a passion for excellent wines, for nature and for art, a visit to the Ca' del Bosco winery is a must.





Programme

The "sun gate", masterpiece of the great sculptor Arnaldo Pomodoro, will open to welcome guests.

Meeting in front of the "Franciacorta model" and departure in groups for a guided tour of the cellars.

We will proceed towards the pressing center with a stop to admire the large white marble sculpture "Heroes of Light" by Igor Mitoraj, then proceeding to the fermentation / vinification cellar, welcomed by the hyper-realistic sculpture of the Brescia artist Bombardieri "the weight of suspended time".

Passing from the laboratory you will go down into the underground cellars to enter the barrel cellar of the red wines before maturation and through the refining tunnel of the Franciacorta, you will arrive at the "Franciacorta dome" where you will have a toast while tasting a glass of Franciacorta accompanied by savory biscuits.

The tour of the cellar continues along the tunnel connecting to the barrel cellar of the second maturation red wines, the 3000 hl, the chardonnay barrel cellar, the cellar with the old barriques for aging great white wines and for dosage syrups, the black tunnel with exposure photography, the bottling hall, the blue tunnel with the disgorgement and labeling line, the packaging and the red tunnel.



Sunday, September 4th Full day guided visit

GARDA LAKE BY BOAT

Lake Garda has a wealth of beauty that reveals its best secrets to those who decide to explore it from a different perspective. During the boat tour, we will show you best places to visit in Lake Garda and take you on a mesmerizing journey of discovery. Lake Garda has much to offer, from ancient Roman ruins to water sports to stunning lake vistas. We will stop in the picturesque town of Sirmione with free time for lunch and visit of the famous Castello Scaligeri. The crenelated castle was built in the 12th century by the Scaligeri family, Verona's ruling family, and was later taken over by the Venetian empire. Surrounded by a moat and drawbridge, this story book like castle boasts restored interiors and panoramic views of the lake.
